# About Haworth

Home of the famous Brontë sisters, in Haworth you can follow in Emily's footsteps and explore the places and landscapes which inspired *Wuthering Heights*.

Discover the timeless charm of Haworth, where cobbled streets, a historic parsonage, and sweeping moors, combine with unique independent shops and cafés to create a captivating atmosphere. Travel by steam through Brontë Country to explore the wider landscapes and attractions, from rail-inspired museums to historic houses.

# Make a day of it

Haworth draws you in with cobbled streets, moorland views and the places that shaped the Brontës. From the Parsonage to the paths toward Wuthering Heights, each spot offers its own mix of atmosphere, history and inspiration.

## Chapters in Focus

- **Morning: Into the Story** – Start on Main Street, wander past stone terraces, and pause in a cosy café as the village wakes.
- **Within These Walls** – Visit the Brontë Parsonage Museum, moving through the rooms where the sisters shaped stories rooted in the surrounding landscape.
- **Steam Powered Journeys** – Ride the Keighley & Worth Valley Railway, its vintage carriages and drifting countryside evoking a quieter era.
- **Echoes of the Past** – Take in East Riddlesden Hall's reflective gardens and centuries old calm, or Cliffe Castle Museum & Park's galleries, glasshouses and parkland.

## Chapters by Night

- **Dusk Delights** – Enjoy dinner in Haworth or nearby Keighley at welcoming inns serving local favourites.
- **Evening Nooks** – Relax with a drink in a traditional pub or catch a film at Keighley Picture House.
- **After Dark Stories** – Join a Haunted Haworth Ghost Tour for legends and atmospheric lanes.
- **A New Chapter Begins** – Wake refreshed and explore walking trails, artisan shops and inspiring landscapes.



## A bit further out

### Thornton Village

Take a guided tour of the Brontë Birthplace, explore the thriving arts scene at South Square Centre or enjoy glorious countryside views from the Thornton Viaduct.

### Saltaire Village

Explore world-class art and spectacular architecture at this inspiring UNESCO World Heritage Site. Salts Mill (open Wed - Sun) hosts works by David Hockney, dining and independent retailers.

### Ilkley

A delicious slice of Yorkshire with a host of cafés, bars and restaurants set amongst the tree-lined streets. Surrounded by stunning walking country, from hikes across the moors to riverside rambles.

## 01 Brontë Parsonage Museum

This elegant Georgian house was home to the Brontë sisters, and is furnished with their possessions, evoking the atmosphere of their time.

Haworth is easily reached by bus from **Keighley** and **Hebden Bridge**, with local rail links via Keighley. Parking includes several pay-and-display car parks, including **West Lane** by the museum and a coach park off **Sun Street**. There is a Clean Air Zone in Bradford, with no charges for passenger cars.
