Popular routes



Ilkley is surrounded by beautiful countryside with amazing scenery and routes to suit all abilities. Take a look at some of these popular routes and start planning your visit today.



Length and Breadth of Ilkley Moor

An invigorating 7 mile walk in the footsteps of the giant Rombald, a great way to experience the flora and fauna of this moorland landscape with some panoramic views across Ilkley and beyond. This circular walk begins at Darwin Gardens on the edge of Ilkley Moor.



Riverside Walk

A pleasant accessible route along the banks of the River Wharfe. Stroll through the Riverside Gardens, cross at the Old Bridge and continue downstream, cross the road at the New Bridge and follow the path to the footbridge, where you can return to Ilkley on the bank nearest the town.



Ilkley Moor Heritage Walks

Created by the Friends of Ilkley Moor, these walks provide the opportunity to discover more about the historic features found on the moors, including the mysterious carved cup and ring stones, while enjoying the spectacular countryside surrounding Ilkley.



Dales Way

The town is the official starting point of this 80 mile long distance trail which finishes at Bowness-on-Windermere. From the Old Bridge, the scenic route follows the banks of the River Wharfe, with Addingham, Bolton Abbey and Grassington within a days' hike.



Food and Drink

Ilkley is known for an abundance of charming, exciting and delicious restaurants and cafés. Whatever you're looking for, you're sure to find something tasty in Ilkley.

There is a wide variety of cafés and coffee shops in Ilkley, and alfresco dining is perfect in the summer. Go to **The Little Tea House** for afternoon tea, **Toast House** for specialty coffee and **Broadley's** for brunch, lunch and dinner! The legendary **Betty's Cafe and Tea Rooms** on The Grove is a Yorkshire institution known for its Fat Rascals and is a great place to visit after a day of sightseeing or shopping.

Dining in Ilkley can take you anywhere in the world, with choices ranging from the Mediterranean to the Far East. Enjoy authentic Italian cuisine at **Emporio Italia**, Portuguese specialties at **Quinta Bar and Grill**, fine Indian cuisine at **Sachi's** or delicious Thai dishes at **Pintoh. Bistrot Pierre** at The Crescent prides itself on French cuisine. A real treat can be enjoyed at The Roof Garden at **Piccolino's**, a fantastic

place to dine whilst enjoying the view of Ilkley Moor. Visit the award winning gourmet restaurant **The Box Tree**, or contemporary British restaurant **Host**, where you can try seasonal and local favourites and relax with friends or family over dinner.

With the lights twinkling in the trees, Ilkley is a special place to spend the evening. Enjoy a glass of wine with tapas at **Martinez Wine Bar**, cocktails at the **Ticket Office Bar** or a charcuterie board at **Friends of Ham**. For the perfect gin and tonic, head to **The Gin Lounge**. If you're looking for a real beer experience, visit pubs like **Flying Duck** or **Baht'at**, which have regularly changing beers on tap. Many of the pubs and bars have excellent menus so why not try a local ale with your meal at **The Black Hat** or **Banyan Bar & Kitchen** in a relaxed contemporary atmosphere. Don't miss the **Fuggle and Golding** tap house and bottle shop, where you can fill up a growler to enjoy your favourites at home too.



Ilkley Moor and Cow and Calf Rocks

On Ilkley Moor there are carvings thought to date from the early Bronze Age, around 1800 BC. There are 400 known 'cup and ring' carved stones across the moors, and their purpose remains a mystery to this day. Features like this make the moor a fascinating place, and a wonderful walk at all times of the year. From White Wells to the Cow and Calf, there's plenty to see – particularly in late July when the heathers bloom. High on Ilkley Moor, the Cow and Calf Rocks are a large rock formation consisting of an outcrop and boulder, also known as

Hangingstone Rocks. According to local legend, the Calf was split from the Cow when the giant Rombald was fleeing an enemy, and stamped on the rock as he leapt across the valley.

The enemy, it is rumoured, was his angry wife. She dropped the stones held in her skirt to form the local rock formation, The Skirtful of Stones. The rocks are a great place to climb and the moor offers spectacular views of Ilkley and beyond.

Originally built around 1700 as an open air spa on the moor, and still operates today for those that would like to take the plunge.

For those that want to stay dry, the cottage, café and museum display make for a lovely stop on a trip around the moor.

Ilkley Manor House

Ilkley Manor House is one of Ilkley's oldest buildings, with parts dating back to the mid-14th century. It is now used as a museum, arts and heritage centre, with a range of events and activities taking place throughout the year.

Self-guided tours of the historic building are available, you will also find interpretation panels outside the building where you can find out more about its fascinating past.

To the rear of the building you will find more information about the Roman occupation of Ilkley, along with remains of the Roman fort, and a section of the Roman wall.

Create something distinctive at **Mrs Duttons Wondrous Workshops**, find custom furniture at **Corner House Interiors** or the perfect accessory for your home at **Nora's Interiors**. Explore **The Plant Point** and **Moss & Moor** garden centre for everything from large plants to lovely succulents for any occasion. Don't miss **Mortens**, known for great practical items for the home and garden.

Pick up the perfect ingredients from **Lishman's of Ilkley**, one of Yorkshire's most popular butchers, or **Moin Moin Bäckerei**, artisan bakers and confectioners offering British and Continental pastries, and on the first Sunday of each month visit **Real Food Ilkley Market**, a celebration of locally produced fine food at The Grove. There's something delicious around every corner in Ilkley.

The Great Outdoors

Surrounded by beautiful countryside, Ilkley offers endless opportunities to enjoy the great outdoors. There are footpaths for all abilities, lovely walks on Ilkley Moor or around Middleton Woods, and along the River Wharfe. You'll find everything from challenging moorland hikes to family friendly pushchair routes.

The views change across the year, don't miss seasonal highlights, including the clouds of blossom in spring. Top places to take in the colour include Riverside Gardens or on a promenade along The Grove. Into May, the bluebells of Middleton Woods create a spectacular carpet of colour, a wonderful accompaniment to a woodland walk.

By late summer the heather starts to bloom and the moors above Ilkley take on their distinctive bright purple shades. Take in the scenery and we are sure you will find a walk to suit you. Ilkley loves cycling, it is home to Ilkley Cycling Club, the largest cycling club

in the country, with over 1000 members. Getting out on two wheels is a great way to explore, and around this area, cyclists can ride routes which were part of the Tour de Yorkshire. The route passed through much of the Bradford district including the steep ascent to the iconic race finish line of the **Cow and Calf Rocks** overlooking the town. Cyclists frequently use the backroad that runs from Ilkley to **Bolton Abbey** but there are many additional road routes and country lanes which provide a network of routes across Wharfedale and towards Embsay, Skipton and the Yorkshire Dales.

If you're looking for a quick pit stop on your bike, Ilkley has a number of welcoming cafés and pubs offering a much-needed drink and bite to keep you going. An ideal destination for cyclists, the **Commuter Coffee House and Cycle Workshop** offers a full range of service and maintenance, with many events and an excellent menu to choose from.

What's On

You can guarantee there is always something happening in Ilkley, from exhibitions and concerts to delicious food markets and beer festivals. Highlights include the Ilkley Trophy, a world-class tennis tournament in the summer, and the Ilkley Literature Festival in the autumn, the most vibrant and prestigious literary festival in the North of England, which is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year. Go to Ilkley Manor House for imaginative activities around the Manor and its lovely courtyard. At the Ilkley Bandstand on The Grove, keep an eye out for a regular concert schedule. Experience entertaining theatre and shows all year round at King's Hall and Winter Gardens and Ilkley Playhouse. Visit Ilkley Cinema to get front-row seats for live performances of the biggest West End, opera, dance, and music cinema release events from around the globe.
