## **Popular routes**

Ilkley is surrounded by beautiful countryside with amazing scenery and routes to suit all abilities. Take a look at some of these popular routes and start planning your visit today.





#### Length and Breadth of Ilkley Moor

An invigorating 7 mile walk in the footsteps of the giant Rombald, a great way to experience the flora and fauna of this moorland landscape with some panoramic views across Ilkley and beyond. This circular walk begins at Darwin Gardens on the edge of Ilkley Moor.



#### Ilkley Moor Heritage Walks

Created by the Friends of Ilkley Moor, these walks provide the opportunity to discover more about the historic features found on the moors, including the mysterious carved cup and ring stones, while enjoying the spectacular countryside surrounding Ilkley.



#### **Riverside Walk**

A pleasant, accessible route along the banks of the River Wharfe. Stroll through the Riverside Gardens, cross at the Old Bridge and continue downstream, cross the road at the New Bridge and follow the path to the footbridge, where you can return to Ilkley on the bank nearest the town.



#### **Dales Way**

The town is the official starting point of this 80 mile long distance trail which finishes at Bowness-on-Windermere. From the Old Bridge, the scenic route follows the banks of the River Wharfe, with Addingham, Bolton Abbey and Grassington within a days' hike.

For an unforgettable movie experience, visit the independent **Ilkley Cinema**. Ideal for an evening with friends or a romantic date, this double screen cinema offers a diverse selection of films, from blockbusters to live theatre and opera screenings.

Throughout the year, Ilkley hosts a diverse range of festivals, including the renowned **Ilkley Literature Festival**, the thrilling **Ilkley Trophy Tennis Tournament**, and the delicious **Ilkley Food & Drink Festival**.



#### Ilkley Moor and Cow and Calf Rocks

Ilkley Moor is the perfect place not only to appreciate the panoramic views, but to also sample one of Ilkley's greatest attractions – its walking. Famous for the Yorkshire anthem "On Ilkley Moor baht 'at", the moor is also a Site of Special Scientific Interest due to its upland habitat for ground-nesting birds.

Across the moor there are 400 carvings, known as 'cup and ring stones'. Thought to date from the early Bronze Age, around 1800 BC, their purpose remains a mystery to this day. Features like this make the moor a fascinating place, and a wonderful walk at all times of the year. From White Wells to the Cow and Calf, there's plenty to see, particularly in late July when the heathers bloom. High on Ilkley Moor, the Cow and Calf Rocks are a large rock formation consisting of an outcrop and boulder, also known as Hangingstone Rocks. They are so named because one is large, with the smaller one sitting close to it, like a cow and calf.

According to local legend, the Calf was split from the Cow when the giant Rombald was fleeing an enemy, and stamped on the rock as he leapt across the valley.

The rocks are a great place to climb, and the moor offers spectacular views of llkley and beyond.

Ilkley Manor House is one of Ilkley's oldest buildings, with parts dating back to the mid-14th century. It is now used as a museum, arts and heritage centre, with a range of events and activities taking place throughout the year. Self-guided tours of the historic building are available, and you will also find interpretation panels outside the building where you can find out more about its fascinating past. To the rear of the building you will find more information about the Roman occupation of Ilkley, along with the remains of the Roman fort, and a section of the Roman wall.

Originally built in the early 18th century as a charming open-air spa, nestled amongst the picturesque Ilkley moor, this incredible Grade II listed building is still in use today and offers an enticing opportunity for individuals seeking a refreshing dip inside the cottage plunge pool. However, for those who prefer to remain on solid ground, the surrounding cottage, café and fascinating museum display provide an equally enjoyable experience, making it an ideal destination for a memorable stopover during an exploration of the breathtaking moorland landscape.

Join the tradition of celebrating the arrival of the New Year by immersing yourself in the plunge pool, an activity that has become synonymous with this special day.

#### The Great Outdoors

Surrounded by beautiful countryside, Ilkley offers endless opportunities to enjoy the great outdoors. There are footpaths for all abilities, lovely walks on **Ilkley Moor** or around **Middleton Woods**, and along the **River Wharfe.** You'll find everything from challenging moorland hikes to family-friendly pushchair routes.

The views change across the year, don't miss seasonal highlights, including the clouds of blossom in spring. Top places to take in the colour include **Riverside Gardens** or on a promenade along **The Grove.** Into May, the bluebells of Middleton Woods create a spectacular carpet of colour, a wonderful accompaniment to a woodland walk.

By late summer the heather starts to bloom and the moors above llkley take on their distinctive bright purple shades. Take in the scenery and we are sure you will find a walk to suit you. Ilkley loves cycling, it is home to Ilkley Cycling Club, the largest cycling club in the country, with over 1000 members. Getting out on two wheels is a great way to explore, and around this area, cyclists can ride routes which were part of the Tour de Yorkshire. The route passed through much of the Bradford district, including the steep ascent to the iconic race finish line of the **Cow and Calf Rocks** overlooking the town. Cyclists frequently use the back road that runs from Ilkley to **Bolton Abbey**, but there are many additional road routes and country lanes which provide a network of routes across Wharfedale and towards Embsay, Skipton and the Yorkshire Dales.

Explore the charming village of **Burley in Wharfedale**, known for its Walkers are Welcome title. Conveniently located, it offers easy access to stunning countryside in every direction, from **Burley Moor** in the south and Ilkley Moor in the west. Take a break at **Cock Pit Farm Tea Room**, a welcoming spot for cyclists, walkers, and furry friends.
