

The year is set to deliver more than 1000 new performances and events including 365 artist commissions, a series of major arts festivals as well as exciting national and international collaborations.

Bus and coach: Regular bus services run from Bradford Interchange across the Bradford district and to surrounding towns and cities. Bradford Interchange is situated in the city centre and is served by National Express

(www.nationalexpress.com). It also services West Yorkshire and there are regular buses to key towns in the area.


Car: Bradford district is well served by motorways. The M606 brings you within 1.5 miles of the city centre. There are links from the M1. A1 and M6 via the M62.

Shopping

If you're in the city centre to shop, then The Broadway Shopping Centre is definitely the best place to start. The city's main shopping centre offers a range of high street brands including Superdry, Marks and Spencer, Next, H&M. Khaadi, HMV and many more. More high street names can be found at Forster Square Retail Park, near the railway station and at the Kirkgate Centre on Darley Street. The city centre is also home to a number of quality independents. An-X and Maison Threads are definitely worth a visit if you're looking for quality men's clothing, while the quirky outlets in Sunbridgewells are ideal for gifts and unique items.

Bradford for Foodies

In Bradford you'll find a world of flavours, with over 200 Asian eateries and a stellar reputation for curry. Try Middle Eastern and Syrian cuisine at Classic Persian, curry with an unique twist at MyLahore, or spice things up at My Thai Cafe.

For a classic Sunday lunch, go to 'Crafted,' Mamma Mia for authentic Italian, and Bread + Roses on North Parade for delicious vegan fare.

The Corn Dolly and Jacobs Well are two excellent real ale pubs in the city where you can enjoy a nice local tipple, or check out the bars on North Parade.

For your sweet tooth the newly opened Haute Dolci, or afternoon tea at Cake'ole at City Park will satisfy.



Alhambra Theatre

Opened in 1914, Bradford's 1400 capacity Alhambra Theatre is regarded as a 'jewel in the crown' of northern theatre. The venue hosts a range of major touring companies including Northern Ballet and the National Theatre and has staged major West End shows including The Lion King, War Horse and Mary Poppins. It's also home to one of the most popular pantomimes in the UK.

Kala Sangam

Bolling Hall Museum

One of Bradford's oldest buildings, and for many years home to two important landowning families the Bollings and the Tempests. Nowadays it is a heritage museum with rooms decorated to give a taste of life at different periods of the house's 500 year history.

Cartwright Hall Art Gallery

Cartwright Hall is Bradford's civic art gallery and offers an exciting programme of contemporary exhibitions. The collections consist mainly of 19th and 20th century British art, with strong collections of international contemporary prints and contemporary South Asian art and crafts. The Hockney Gallery includes some of the artists early work and provides an introduction to his life and art with a particular focus on Yorkshire and Bradford.

Bradford Industrial Museum

Bradford's Industrial Museum has permanent displays of textile machinery, steam power, engineering, printing machinery and motor vehicles, along with an exciting exhibitions programme. You can enjoy the splendour of Moorside House where the Mill Manager lived, or visit the Millworkers' terraced houses dressed to reflect three different time periods.

Undercliffe Cemetery

Undercliffe Cemetery has been described as one of the most striking achievements of Victorian funerary design with grand nineteenth-century monuments, elaborate tombs, finely decorated obelisks and extravagant mausoleums, along with sweeping views over the city. The listed monuments, amongst others, have QR codes so that you can find out more about who they commemorate with a click of your smart phone.
