Wild Bee Café - Freddie Yauner + Max Fraser

It's 2031 and there has been a catastrophic collapse of wild pollinating insects across the world. The collapse had been predicted by scientists, but the speed caught everyone out...

Wild Bee Café is a mobile drinks kiosk which plays out this scenario. Passers-by are lured in, only to be met with the disappointing reality of a menu greatly compromised with the loss of many core ingredients.

Hosted by artist Freddie Yauner, Wild Bee Café will tour Shipley in the run-up to the Saltaire Arts Trail weekend, starting at Shipley College working with students to forage and make elderflower cordial which will be served to the people of Shipley throughout the week.

Pollen Paintings - Freddie Yauner

FOYER GALLERY: A range of text works, painstakingly produced with pen and pollen ink, which catalogue Freddie's own journey in understanding the threat of environmental destruction. Plus a new film work which animates pollen portraits of key protagonists in the agricultural system.

ROOF SPACE: An installation of large scale pollen paintings that explore agricultural irrigation and landscapes. Painting live during the weekend and building up the content over time, the space will be populated by large monotone pollen images of tractors, fieldscapes and irrigation structures.

Habitat - Bradford School of Art WASH HOUSE GARDENS Sat 27 - Mon 29 May, 10am - 4pm FREE – no booking required

For this project, students from the Foundation Degree in Textiles Practice at Bradford School of Art took the theme of 'habitat', considering what that might mean to different people, animals or plants. They explored how we create connection and a sense of place in the domestic and architectural spaces of Saltaire, as well as wildlife habitats, urban green spaces and rewilding.

FdA Textiles Practice is a unique part-time programme, for those wishing to develop professional practice in textile art, contemporary craft and design. The course is designed for those from non-traditional learning

routes and learners who need to organise study flexibly.

Tales From the Loom - Chrissie Freeth UNITED REFORMED CHURCH Sat 27 - Mon 29 May, 11am - 4pm FREE – no booking required

The loom has been central to storytelling for centuries, although usually political and religious propaganda hanging from the walls of castles and cathedrals. Chrissie Freeth's work continues this tradition but transforms small personal moments, fragile memories, and unconfronted experiences into large-scale handwoven, contemporary tapestries.

Chrissie plays with traditional iconography and a personal vocabulary of symbolism to build her narratives. Although medieval tapestries remain a foundational inspiration and academic interest her work reimagines them for contemporary relevance.

Chrissie works on a traditional upright loom in her workroom in Saltaire, where she will work one to two thousand hours to weave a single tapestry.

A photographic project about nature, our connection to it and each other, that is in development towards an exhibition in 2024.

Local artist photographer Phil is seeking participants to take part. He'll be on the footpath, where he'll be able to speak more about the project and offer portraits of local people immersed in nature. No booking is required - Phil will be happy to see you.

Mills Transformed is a photographic project documenting mill buildings in the north of England which have been restored and repurposed through the passion and determination of inspiring local people.

Local photographer Neil Horsley interviewed and photographed the people who have renovated and brought new life to 25 disused mills. This exhibition features a selection of images telling the stories of the mills and their respective owners and renovators which will be featured in a forthcoming book.

Saltaire: People, Heritage & Place - University of Bradford

This immersive installation will offer up new ways to view, interpret and connect with the buildings, monuments and places within Saltaire World Heritage Site and its setting within Bradford District.

The installation draws upon the artistic qualities of digital data developed by the 'Visualising Heritage' team at the University of Bradford, alongside heritage reinterpreted and reimagined by Saltaire Primary and Wycliffe Primary school children, led by artist Sharon Snaylam.

Artwork developed in conjunction with both schools can be viewed on Fri 26 May, 5pm-6pm at Wycliffe School. These installations have been made possible with the generous support of Salts Estates, both schools, and funding from the Arts & Humanities Research Council's Place Programme which has helped to expand coverage of Saltaire as part of 'Virtual Bradford' – a digital twin for the city.

A Year in Normandie - David Hockney
