A SNAPSHOT OF **BRADFORD'S CINEMA HISTORY**


W E Berry Ltd, one of the most important producers of film posters, was based in **Bradford from 1888** to 2004. The National Science and Media Museum 16 (free entry) has a substantial collection of posters donated by the firm in its collection.

The first purpose-built cinema – the King's See the locations of other historical cinemas in Bradford on the map, including Unit Four, Arcadian, Malboro, Sangeet and Scala.

Bradford became a hub for South Asian cinema in the 1960s and 1970s, with seven venues showing exclusively Indian films - ahead of its time in the UK.
